"Membership in The Society is limited to employees and family members of Life, Health, and General Insurance and related Companies, Brokerages, and the Society, past members and family members of existing members; family members is given to include spouses, brothers, sisters, children, parents, in-laws, cousins and grand relations, who are good character, and have attained the age permitted by the Co-operative Societies Act."

WHEREAS strict adherence to this Rule restricts the membership growth of this Credit Union at a time when such growth is necessary for the Credit Union to keep apace with the needs of its current members;

WHEREAS changes in the financial sector have reduced the overall membership potential for this Credit Union;

WHEREAS the Credit Union is actively seeking to expand its membership base to remain viable in the current competitive market;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE SAID RULE BE AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:
